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Use this template to guide a discussion within your team and create an action plan on how the 4 R's of responsible parasiticide prescribing (Review, Replace, Reduce and Refine) can be applied in your practice.

<p>1. Review the evidence - raise awareness of concerns and why responsible prescribing is important</p>	
<p>What is the team's current awareness of the environmental concerns surrounding parasiticide treatments?</p> <p>How do the team feel about these concerns?</p> <p>Does any supporting information need to be shared with the team?</p>	
<p>2. Review your current prescribing - identify areas where a more targeted approach could be applied</p>	
<p>What products do you stock and use and in what animals?</p> <p>What Parasites are the team concerned about targeting?</p> <p>What discussion do team members currently have with owners?</p>	

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<p>3. Revising your prescribing - identify how risk assessment applies to your patients and can replace blanket treatments and reduce overuse of parasiticides.</p>	
<p>What parasites do you think your patients are at risk of in your area?</p> <p>Which patients or households are at higher risk?</p> <p>Could you offer testing regimes that would help with tailored treatment?</p> <p>Could you stock alternative products?</p> <p>How can you discuss this with owners?</p> <p>What barriers may be encountered if making a change and how do you overcome these?</p>	
<p>4. Action Plan- Discuss how will you apply risk assessment to your patients to refine prescribing protocols</p>
