• KEY IMPACTS

Here are some suggestions for you to consider:

- Use of fossil fuels (i.e. oil and gas usage)
- Use of electricity
- Waste generation & disposal
- Use of anaesthetic gases
- Use of water
- Carbon emissions from transport of personnel & animals
- Carbon emissions from fleet vehicles
- Carbon emissions from staff & customer travel
- Consumption of raw materials (including prescribed drugs, medical plastics, needles)
- Use of parasiticides
- Use of antimicrobials
- Procurement of goods & services

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• ACTIONS

Clearly identify where you are going to take action: 'Having identified the key environmental impacts of our practice, we commit to reducing these through a journey of continual improvement. **By utilising the following principles of the Vet Sustain <u>Greener Veterinary Practice Checklist</u>, we pledge to contribute to a healthy environment for our employees and patients through the following actions:...' Highlight 2-3 key actions you will undertake under each heading to create your action plan, there are some suggestions below but you should personalise these to you.**

1. Practise responsible resource use:

Examples include: monitoring key resources such as electricity, gas, water and setting targets for reduction; put water-saving measures in place; reduce use of disposable materials such as single use plastics; go paper-free; make sustainable choices when purchasing equipment/consumables; review and optimise waste management implementing the 3Rs (reduce, re-use, recycle); review staff travel and transport. Please note - the RCVS PSS requires a clear waste reduction and recycling plan.

2. Be sustainable in our operation:

Examples include: promote animal welfare; create a travel policy to reduce emissions associated with commuting/business travel; support greener transport to work (e.g. bike to work scheme); reduce carbon emissions from practice meetings/conference attendance; review anaesthetic gas use and set targets for reduction; encourage responsible use of medicines; encourage responsible disposal of medicines; consider eco-design/building adaptations where possible; ensure environmental legislation compliance; use evidence-based infection control measures and minimise use of eco-toxic chemicals; enhance on-site green spaces and promote biodiversity in surroundings; support environmentally responsible, welfare friendly animal care amongst clients and the wider community.

- **3. Use medicines responsibly:** Examples include: practise responsible use of medicines; avoid drug wastage through good stock control; encourage appropriate drug disposal among staff and clients.
- 4. Empower the team: Examples include: Convey sustainability policy to the whole team and encourage continued participation by all team members; access sustainability focused forums and training; recognise that good health and wellbeing supports all aspects of practice operations.
- 5. Create a green group/green lead.

• TARGETS

Set targets for what you hope to achieve. For example: 'We [insert practice name] pledge to reducing our environmental impact through a journey of continual improvement and [e.g. reduce our carbon emissions by 10% in the next 2 years] and through our commitment to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons Practice Standards Accreditation Scheme Sustainability Award*.

• COMMUNICATION

Having it easily accessible on the practice website is encouraged. The policy should be signed by someone in the senior management team to show your practice's commitment and updated regularly.
